#### **Description:**

On June 16, 2014 ALES organized a conference in the ceremonial room of the Austrian Federal Ministry of Justice on one of the fastest growing criminal areas: Cybercrime. The conference examined the topic from various angles. Attention was not only given to criminal offences in Austrian law but also to the international dimension and technical possibilities of cybercriminals and related dangers as well as cyber defense from the perspective of national defense. The ensuing panel discussion focused on questions regarding the effective prosecution on the internet. In line with the mission of ALES, the conference offered an interdisciplinary approach to current societal problems. The conference was opened by Mag. Christian Pilnacek (director general within the Ministry of Justice) and Univ.-Prof. Dr. Susanne Reindl-Krauskopf (head of ALES).
