Project description:

On 11 November 2019 the 8th ALES annual conference on „Artificial Intelligence – Curse or Blessing“ took place. During the meeting, interdisciplinary questions, which result from the progress on the field of artificial intelligence and have an impact on the law, were discussed. The opening speech explained intelligent systems from the engineering sciences' angle. The following presentation approached the topic from the German perspective featuring constitutional, civil, penal and data protection law aspects as well as legal philosophical components.
