ALES analyses – in close cooperation with Univ.-Prof. Dr. Schulev-Steindl – which cases of emergency and crisis are currently addressed by Austrian legal provisions, also taking into account comparable regulations in other selected states. A special focus will be laid on questions, such as: Who is competent to declare a state of emergency and which special legal regime enters into force for which period of time? Which system of legal protection and judicial remedy corresponds with such a regime of emergency? How can the measures provided for an effective crisis management be re-embodied in democratic legislation?
